INDUCTEE DeWitt Boyd

Tennis Coach

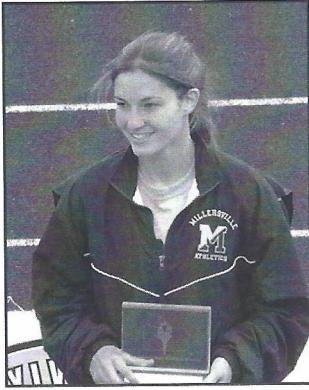
From 1994 to 2007, DeWitt Boyd created a dynasty at Millersville University, leading the men's tennis program to nine NCAA Tournament appearances while also capturing five PSAC Championships and nine NCAA Tournament berths with the women's program.

Boyd holds the all-time wins record in both sports, posting a 144-73 record with the men and a 172-73-2 record with the women. The PSAC named Boyd the men's tennis coach of the year in 2006, and he won the award four times on the women's side including three times in a row between 1999-2001.

Boyd coached Keith Mahaffey to a PSAC Athlete of the Year award in 2002. In 1998, Boyd mentored Kristen Maneral to Millersville's first

women's athlete of the year award. Lauren Witmer also won it in 2001. Boyd coached nine of the top 15 winningest players in the history of the men's program and 12 of the top 15 winningest players in the history of the women's program.

In his very first season, Boyd led the Marauders to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. That started a run of eight consecutive appearances that included two trips to the NCAA Quarterfinals. Boyd led the women's program to its first PSAC Championship with a 20-4-1 record in 1997-98, and the Marauders won at least a share of the title in five consecutive seasons. His team advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament five times.



INDUCTEE

Christina Carpenter Minder '05

*Women's Track and Field
B.S.E./Education*

Christina Carpenter dominated sprint races from 2003-05, winning five PSAC Championship events for the Marauder track and field team. Twice Carpenter was named the PSAC Outdoor Championships Athlete of the Meet, and she totaled 10 career All-PSAC finishes while recording some of the top times in program history.

Carpenter's first breakthrough at the PSAC level came at the 2002 PSAC Indoor Championships where she finished third in both the 55-meter dash and the 200-meter dash. Carpenter won her first PSAC Championship in the spring of 2003, running a 12.29 to win the 100-meter dash. She also finished as the PSAC runner-up in the 200.

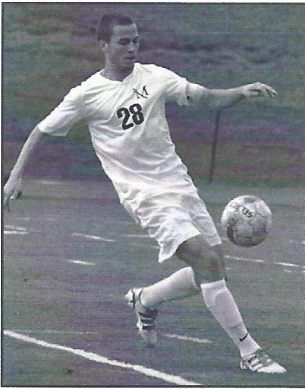
She started her junior season of 2003-04 with runner-up finishes in both the 55 and 200 at the PSAC Indoor Championships. Her 7.30 in the 55 is still the fourth-fastest time in program history. That same season, she ran a school record 200 time of 25.94 that stood for seven years. In the outdoor season, Carpenter became just the second Marauder to win a PSAC Championship in both the 100 and 200. She ran a career-best 11.91 in the 100

and a career-best 24.34 in the 200 on her way to being named both the PSAC Outdoor Championships Track Athlete of the Meet and the overall championship athlete of the meet. Carpenter's 11.91 was the fastest time at Millersville in 20 years and remains the third fastest in program history. Carpenter's 200 time was also the fastest in 20 years and ranks second at Millersville to this day. Her times in both races earned her a spot at the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

As a senior, Carpenter took second at the indoor championships in the 200, and then repeated as the PSAC Outdoor Championships Track Athlete of the Meet. She became the first—and remains the only Marauder—to repeat as winner of the 100 and 200. She ran an 11.93 in the 100 and a 24.73 in the 200, and qualified for the NCAA Outdoor Championships for a second consecutive season.

Carpenter capped her career with the Elwood J. Finley Award, given to the top Millersville senior athlete.

Carpenter received a bachelor's degree in education in 2005.



INDUCTEE John Claffey '12

*Men's Soccer
B.S./Finance*

Remarkably reliable and consistently outstanding, John Claffey anchored the defense of the Millersville men's soccer team during the most successful four-year stretch in program history. With Claffey on the back line, Millersville reached unprecedented heights, posting a 60-18-5 record with two PSAC East titles, three NCAA Tournament appearances, the program's first PSAC Championship and a memorable run to the NCAA Semifinals in 2011—a team that Claffey captained.

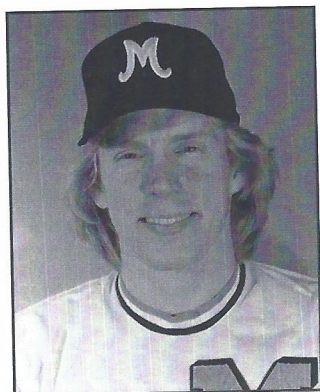
Claffey started all 83 of Millersville's games from 2008-11. He was named All-PSAC East First team as a freshman in 2008 and All-PSAC First Team in 2011. Claffey earned NSCAA All-Atlantic Region recognition as a sophomore in 2009 and again as a senior in 2011. Following his senior season, Claffey entered elite company by picking up NSCAA and Daktronics All-America Third Team recognition. That made him only the third Millersville men's soccer player to be named All-America.

A primary reason for Millersville's run of success was its defense. With Claffey on patrol, the Marauders totaled 40 shutouts over the four years, leading the PSAC in that category in 2009 and leading the league in goals against average in 2008. Claffey's defense held opponents to no more than 1.0 goal per game in each of the four seasons.

Claffey made an immediate impact in 2008, helping the Marauders to a school record 18 victories, a PSAC East title and the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance. The team reached the NCAA Quarterfinals. The Marauders went 17-3 during Claffey's sophomore season of 2009 and achieved the first No. 1 national ranking in program history. The Marauders finished as the PSAC runners-up and reached the NCAA Tournament again.

Claffey's senior season included a magical postseason run that was of course, spurred on by a defense that did not allow a single goal in the first five postseason games. Millersville won the PSAC Championship on its home field by a 1-0 score over Bloomsburg. A pair of NCAA Tournament shutouts put the Marauders in the NCAA Quarterfinals against Rockhurst. A 0-0 tie pushed the teams into penalty kicks, and Claffey's conversion in the fourth round helped the Marauders to a shootout win and a berth in the NCAA Semifinals. Fittingly, Claffey was named to the NCAA All-Tournament Team.

Claffey graduated with a bachelor's degree in finance in 2012 and currently serves as a regional vice president at Jackson National. Claffey is married to 2018 Millersville University Athletics Hall of Fame inductee, Elicia Anderson Claffey '12. The couple have two girls: Alivia and Brinley.



INDUCTEE

Jay Johnson '77

Baseball
B.A./Economics

Ranking among the greatest hitters in Millersville history, Jay Johnson was a key offensive performer from 1974-77, helping the Marauders to a pair of PSAC Championships under the direction of Millersville Athletics Hall of Fame coach Gene Wise.

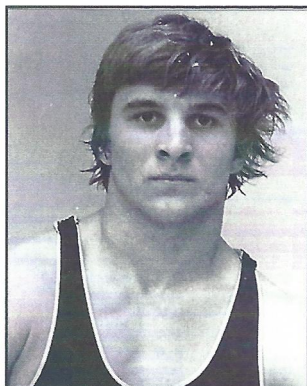
Johnson posted a career batting of .398, a tally that ranks fourth in Millersville history to this day. Johnson led the 1974 championship team in RBIs, led the team in doubles in 1975 and 1977 and led the 1976 club in triples.

Playing alongside fellow hall of famer Bob Rossi, Johnson led the Marauders in hitting as a junior and senior. He hit

.393 in 1976, and in 1977, he set a school record with a .459 batting average—a record that stood until 1990. It still ranks second all-time.

Johnson's offense landed him All-PSAC East First Team honors three times, including a unanimous selection following his senior season. Johnson, Rossi, former MLB Draft pick Chris Murphy and Chas McCormick, a current member of the Houston Astros organization, are the only players in program history to be a three-time first team selection.

Johnson graduated in 1977 with a bachelor's degree in economics.



INDUCTEE

Randy March '83

Wrestling
B.A./Industrial Arts

In the 72 storied years of the Millersville wrestling program, no grappler won more matches than Randy March. From 1978-82, March compiled a 110-38-1 record and has held the school wins record since.

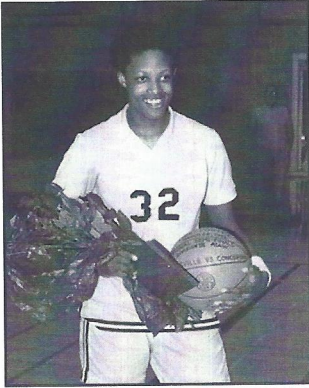
March was a force wrestling at 167 and 177 pounds. He qualified for the NCAA Division III Championships twice and seamlessly transitioned to the Division I ranks where he qualified for the championships as a senior.

A four-time PSAC Championships placewinner, March finished as the runner-up once while also placing third, fourth and fifth during his stellar career. In 1981-82, March delivered a 37-6-1 record, which stands as the third highest

single-season win total in program history.

A testament to his leadership, March served as a team captain twice. As a senior, March was recognized as the Theodore H. Rupp Award winner, an award presented to the most valuable Millersville wrestler.

March graduated with a bachelor's degree in industrial arts in 1983. He continues to work as a technology education teacher at Dover Area High School. March served as the school's wrestling coach from 1983-89 and served more than 20 years as an official, even working the PIAA State Championships.



INDUCTEE

Darlene Newman '84

*Women's Basketball/Lacrosse/Coach
B.S.E./Industrial Arts*

A fixture and integral member of Millersville University and its athletics department for nearly 40 years, Darlene Newman started as a two-sport standout athlete and became the women's basketball program's assistant coach during arguably the program's most successful era.

A three-time All-PSAC East honoree in basketball from 1979-83, Newman ranks among the most productive players in program history. She totaled 1,305 career points—a total that ranks ninth all-time. Newman's 14.8 points per game scoring average still ranks first all-time. Newman also ranks second in career field goals made and second in career field goal percentage. Newman averaged a Millersville-best 10.3 rebounds per game over the course of her career and she is fifth all-time in blocked shots with 139.

In her sophomore season of 1980-81, Newman led the Marauders in both scoring and rebounding. She averaged 16.6 points per game and pulled down 12.9 rebounds per game—a mark that still stands as a record. As a junior, Newman repeated as the team's leader in scoring and rebounding, averaging 14.4

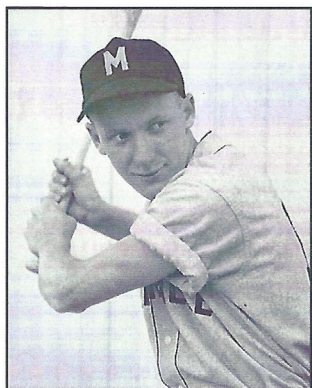
points and 8.8 rebounds per game. As a senior in 1982-83, Newman grabbed a team-leading 12.2 rebounds per game.

Under the direction of hall of fame coach Deb Schlegel, Newman's 1981-82 team won a then-school record 20 games. As a senior, Newman led the Marauders to a 17-4 record and the program's first PSAC Championship.

After her seasons on the hardwood, Newman transitioned to the lacrosse field where she helped the 1982 team to an AIAW Division II Championship.

Newman graduated with a bachelor's degree in industrial technology in 1984. She joined the Millersville basketball program as its assistant coach in 1992-93 and served in that role for 24 seasons. During that time, Millersville won six PSAC East titles, a PSAC Championship and made nine NCAA Tournament appearances.

Even after retiring from coaching, Newman continues to make an impact in the academic success of Millersville students. She now serves as the Director of Student Access and Support Services.



INDUCTEE

Kenneth Stoner '53

*Baseball/Men's Basketball
B.S.E./Biology Education*

An All-PSAC selection in two sports, Kenneth "Red" Stoner made an impact for the Marauders on both the baseball field and the basketball court.

Stoner was a four-year letterman in baseball and a three-year letterman in basketball. Over the course of his baseball career Stoner posted a near-.400 average, batting .372 as a freshman and .453 as a sophomore in 1951. In addition to his hitting, Stoner was a fine fielder as the team's third baseman and shortstop.

In basketball, Stoner earned All-PSAC First Team honors in 1952-53 and picked up honorable mention recognition in 1951-52. Stoner was a team captain and

one of the leading scorers in his senior year. Stoner was also sixth in the PSAC in scoring and ranked first in free throw percentage.

After graduating with a bachelor's degree in biological science, Stoner served as a teacher in the Greencastle-Antrim School District where he coached basketball and baseball. After military service, he then taught and coached basketball in the Eastern York School District for 25 years, winning more than 300 games and two York County League titles. Stoner also served as a basketball and baseball PIAA official from 1953-1996. Stoner is also a member of the Susquehanna Valley Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame.

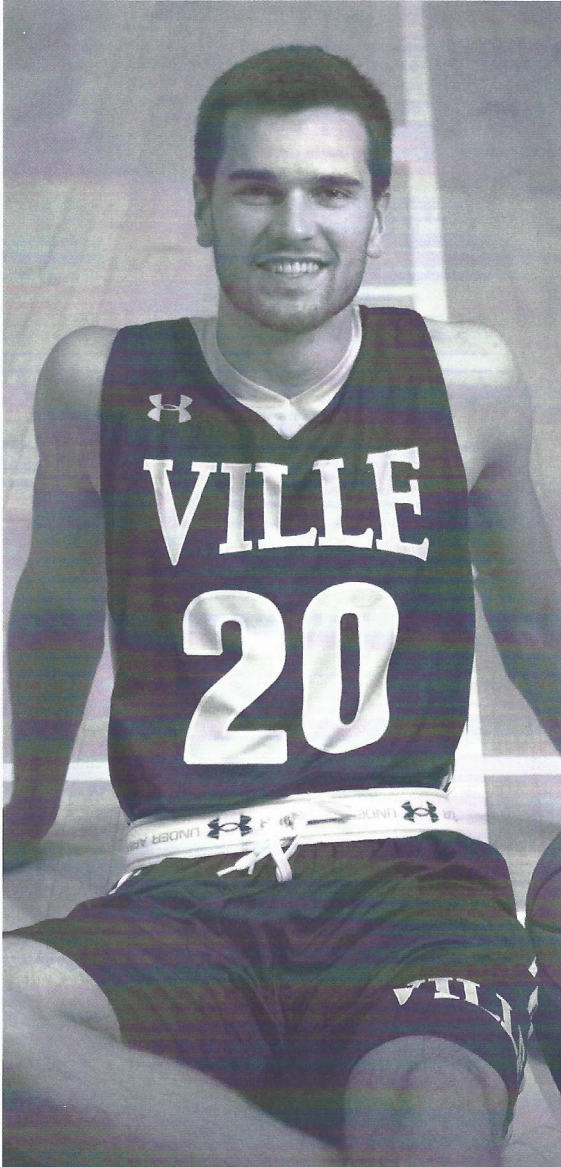
